These three elements i.e. building a culture of understanding and regional consciousness; nurturing a new class of liberal, bright and quality leadership and building the capacity of the region in science, technology and other disciplines considered vital for improving the quality of life of the people, therefore, form the core objectives of the South Asian University.



### Yet Another Milestone Year

The year 2016 has been a year of many major changes as well as of many vital steps forward. We are delighted that the task of creating a permanent physical space for the university has begun with the construction of the first five buildings of phase one, which is going on at a smart pace. Even more encouraging is the fact that the contract for the construction of the next set of buildings has also been awarded.

The year started with the appointment of two new Vice Presidents and a host of Associate Deans. Professor Santosh Panda, Dean, Faculty of Economics and Professor Sasanka Perera, Dean, Faculty of Social Sciences were elevated to the posts of Vice President and Dr V G Hegde and Dr Senthil Venugopal have been appointed as Associate Deans. It is also a matter of immense pride that Professor Yogesh Tyagi, Dean, Faculty of Legal Studies has moved to Delhi University as Vice Chancellor. We wish him the best in the years to come.

The South Asian University also organized its first Convocation on 11 June 2016. It was a momentous occasion for all of us. The Convocation, presided over by our Visitor's nominee, Mr. Kamal Thapa, Deputy Prime Minister and Minister for Foreign Affairs of Nepal, and graced by General VK Singh, Minister of State for External Affairs of India, was attended by the members of the various statutory bodies of the university, distinguished guests and dignitaries from various organizations, besides graduating students and their parents, who came from all corners of SAARC at very short notice to attend the event. 652 students were awarded degrees during the Convocation with 32 of them receiving Gold Medals for outstanding academic achievements.

We celebrated the SAARC Charter Day with an inspirational inaugural address by Mr M J Akbar, Minister

of State for External Affair, Government of India on 'The Challenge of Modernity' in the context of South Asia. The day's programme also included a screening of films from Nepal and Afghanistan as well as a panel discussion on 'Cinema and Society in South Asia' in which scholars from the different countries of South Asia participated. The day ended with a rendering of Sufi music by Chaar Yaar. We have had the privilege of having Ms Sushma Swaraj, Minister for External Affair, Government of India and Professor Gowher Rizvi, Advisor to the Prime Minister of Bangladesh, in the last two commemoration events of this historic day.

As a part of our on-going campaign on tie-ups with like-minded universities and organizations, we have signed multiple Memoranda of Understanding on mutually agreeable terms with many universities and institutions across the world. The progress made by the university has been possible with the collective effort of all the stakeholders of the University. I look forward to their continued support and co-operation while hoping that the new academic year will bring many more such opportunities to take the University forward.

I would also like to take this opportunity to express our sense of gratitude to the governments of the eight SAARC member nations that comprise the SAU family as well as all the statutory bodies of the University. Every little achievement accomplished by the South Asian University, which embodies the idea of cooperation, is a step forward for the region and is testimony to the fact that we as a region can achieve much more with enhanced engagement and continued co-operation.

### **Decision Making Bodies Of SAU**

### **Governing Board (GB)**

The Governing Board of the South Asian University (SAU) is the highest policy and decision-making authority of the University, which oversees the academic, administrative and financial management of the University. It consists of two members from each of the SAARC Member States, nominated by the respective Member State, in the manner prescribed in the Regulations.

During the period under report, the Governing Board deliberated upon various administrative, academic and policy matters and took important decisions. Some of the important matters considered and approved in the Governing Board are as follows:

 Revised Bye-laws on: Compulsory Class Attendance; Rules governing issues of Sexual Harassment and Alumni Association of South Asian University;

- Regulation on Powers of the Finance Committee;
- Operational Budget Estimates for Financial Year 2016 (July-Dec 2016) and Financial Year 2017;
- Capital Budget Estimates for Financial Year 2017;
- Appointment of University's Statutory Auditors;
- Amendments in existing Regulations relating to Doctor of Philosophy/Master of Philosophy/ Master's programmes on the recommendations of the Academic Council and
- Extending the first phase of the University by two more years, i.e. till the end of calendar year 2018.



### **Executive Council (EC)**

The Executive Council (EC) of SAU is the prime body responsible for major executive decisions. Besides senior functionaries of the SAU, the EC has four members who are nominated by the SAARC member states by rotation. The President of the SAU chairs the EC meetings. The Executive Council is vested with the powers to make teaching and other senior administrative appointments on the recommendation of the selection Committees, fix their emoluments and define their duties. The Executive Council is also vested with the powers to maintain discipline amongst the teaching and non-teaching staff in accordance with Rules, Regulations and Byelaws and manage and regulate finances, accounts and other administrative affairs of the University.

The Council deliberated upon various administrative and academic matters and took important decisions during the period under report. Some of the important matters considered and approved by the Council are as follows:

- Extension of the service of teaching/non-teaching members who have completed their five-year contract;
- Celebration of SAU Day;
- Constitution of an Investment Committee;
- Formulation of an Investment Policy and
- Revision of Travel entitlements.



### **Academic Council (AC)**

The Academic Council (AC) is the custodian of all academic activities of the SAU. It is vested with powers to recommend establishment and abolishment of Faculties, Departments, Institutions, Inter-disciplinary Research Centres, Specialized Laboratories and Libraries, etc. The Academic Council is also vested with the power to recommend to the Executive Council the creation and abolition of teaching posts in the University, draft regulations regarding admissions and examinations, appointment of examiners, conferment of honorary degrees and institution of fellowships and scholarships, etc.

The Academic Council deliberated upon various academic matters during the period under report. Some

of the important matters considered by the Council are as follows:

- Revised Scholarships/Financial Support Guidelines for the Academic Session 2016 – 17;
- Proposal for a 2-week Orientation Programme for new entrants;
- Mentoring & Tutoring of students and
- Amendments in existing Regulations relating to Doctor of Philosophy/Master of Philosophy/ Master's Programmes.



### Finance Committee (FC)

The Finance Committee of the University considers the annual accounts, financial estimates and expenditure proposals. The annual accounts and estimates of the University, duly approved by the Finance Committee, are submitted to the Executive Council for approval. The Finance Committee deliberated upon various important issues pertaining to the University's finances in its 5th meeting held on 20.07.2016.

Some of the important matters approved or recommended by the Committee are as follows:-

- Operational Budget Estimates for Financial Years 2016 and 2017
- Capital Budget Estimates for Financial Year 2017
- University's Accounts and Reports of External Auditors
- Appointment of Statutory Auditors for the year 2017

- Internal Audit System for the University and its Modalities
- Investment Committee
- Investment Policy
- Revision of Travel Entitlements

#### **SAU Administration**

SAU is a relatively young University and at present administrative support is provided by a skeletal staff. Currently, there are only 42 non-teaching employees in the University. The Chairperson of SAARC is the Visitor of the University. Dr Kavita A Sharma is the President of the University and Prof. Santosh C Panda and Prof. Sasanka Perera are the Vice Presidents. At the Faculty level, administrative responsibilities are also shared by the Deans of various Faculties. Dr A K Malik is the Registrar of the University.

# **University Finances**

The capital cost of establishing the University, estimated originally to be approximately, USD 300 million for the first phase, is being borne by the Government of India. In addition, the Government of India has also provided, free of cost, about 100 acres of land in South Delhi for setting up the main campus of the South Asian University. The operational cost of running the University is shared, on year-to-year basis, by all SAARC Member States and the

contribution of individual Member States is governed by a formula that has jointly been evolved by the eight countries. The Business Plan of the University that contains the University budget figures has been approved by the Governing Board of the University.

The operational and capital budget estimates for the year 2016 are to the tune of US\$ 8.18 million and US\$ 36.37 million respectively.



### Major Highlights of the Year

### First Convocation - SAU Graduates Conferred Degrees

The University conducted its maiden convocation at the Plenary Hall, Vigyan Bhawan, New Delhi on 11 June 2016. Mr Kamal Thapa, Deputy Prime Minister and Foreign Affairs Minister of Nepal presided over the ceremony while General V K Singh, the Minister of State for External Affairs, Government of India was the Chief Guest.

A total of 652 students were conferred the Master's Degrees in various programmes such as Applied Mathematics, Biotechnology, Computer Science, Development Economics, International Relations, Legal Studies and Sociology while two scholars were conferred the MPhil Degree. 30 programme toppers were honoured with SAU Gold Medals. Students from all the eight SAARC countries were present at the convocation.

In his speech, Mr. Kamal Thapa stressed upon the role the university is playing in bringing better understanding in the South Asian region. He added that South Asia as a region is gaining importance in the world because of the shared prosperity the region is experiencing, backed by the economic growth of India. He felt that it was the responsibility of India to take this forward.

General V K Singh talked about the commonality the countries of the region share – history, geography, culture, aspirations and even challenges. He also spoke about the importance of co-operation in education to collectively fulfil the objectives set out for the region. He also suggested that all students keep the friendships they have made in the university alive as they are the future of the region and their friendship will go a long way in bringing about prosperity in the region, a view also shared by the Mr Kamal Thapa.



As expressed by Mr. Narendra Modi, the Prime Minister of India at the 2014 Nepal Summit of SAARC and in line with the directives of the Governing Board, the South Asian University has entered into partnerships with numerous universities in the South Asian region, informed Dr. Kavita A. Sharma, the President of SAU in her speech. She also informed the gathering, that included Ambassadors and High Commissioners of the SAARC nations as well as many other dignitaries, about the soon-to-be established

Institute of South Asian Studies, an inter-disciplinary research institute which will undertake research on issues of common interest in the region.

With the commencement of the construction of the permanent campus of the South Asian University recently in Maidan Garhi in New Delhi, General V.K. Singh reiterated India's commitment to bear the entire capital cost to set up the campus. He ended by observing that 'Most of the gold medal winners in the convocation today are girls'.





### **SAARC Charter Day**

South Asian University celebrated the 32nd SAARC Charter Day in the South Asian University campus on 8 December 2016 with activities spread across the day comprising a panel discussion, film screenings and a sufi music concert. Mr. MJ Akbar, Minister of State for External Affairs, Government of India, delivered the inaugural address as the chief guest.

While observing that SAARC is experiencing multiple problems, the minister noted that the South Asian University was functioning far more smoothly than the regional body itself. He said that universities have their share of difficulties, particularly when they are in their infancy, but the scholarship and work done by the South Asian University is at a level that other universities usually take a long while to achieve.

SAU has been focussing on educating the young minds of the region, and this is a great place to learn diplomacy and the importance of understanding the subtext which controls our understanding of the region, Mr. Akbar added.

Addressing the gathering, which consisted of ambassadors from the SAARC member nations, dignitaries from ministries and think tanks, students, faculty and the professional staff of SAU, the minister spoke at length about the challenge of modernity in the context of South Asia. Modernity, he said, is an easy word to use but difficult to define and it has nothing to do with the presence or absence of modern clothes and technology. The definition of modernity, he said, is freedom – freedom of thought, freedom of faith, freedom of gender and freedom from hunger.





There is no freedom of expression without freedom of thought and without freedom of thought there can be no democracy and therefore, eventually no modernity, he added. Questioning, in a democracy, should never stop. On freedom of faith, he said there should be freedom to choose one's faith and that should not exclude one's choice to be an unbeliever or an atheist. There cannot be modernity if there is no gender equality in society and it is even against shariat law to deny gender equality, he said. If the present generation is able to achieve these four freedoms, it would be a great tribute to the generation that worked to achieve freedom from imperialism and they would then have played their part in the historic transformation of the world, the minister said.

In her welcome address, Dr. Kavita Sharma, President of SAU, expressed the hope that SAU would soon have a permanent campus of its own as the first phase of construction was progressing smoothly and the second phase would start soon.

The inaugural function was followed by a panel discussion on "Cinema and Society in South Asia" with three eminent panelists – filmmaker Rahul Roy from India, publisher Kanak Mani Dixit from Nepal and filmmaker Prasanna Vithanage from Sri Lanka. The session was chaired by Prof. Sasanka Perera, Vice President, SAU.

No celebration seems complete without some music, and to fulfill that requirement, an experimental sufi band, Chaar Yaar, performed an eclectic set of numbers to entertain the crowd. The last activity of the day was the screening of films – *Dying Dreams* directed by Sudath Abeysiriwardane from Sri Lanka and *Boxing Girls of Kabul* directed by Ariel Nasr from Afghanistan. The day marked the celebration of this historic day for three years in a row in SAU.



### **SAU Gallery**

Exhibitions ranging from solo to group shows, speciallythemed mixed media shows to photo exhibitions, the SAU Gallery showcased a number of artworks during the year. Some of the prominent ones are featured here.

### Phantoms-In-Transit: An Intriguing Solo Exhibition

A solo exhibition tilted "Phantoms-in-Transit" by the young artist Subrata Das was on display at the SAU gallery from 12 April 2016 till 1 May 2016. The exhibition unraveled the lives and experiences of migrant workers across cities. Seemingly, they become phantoms-in-transit in various

parts of South Asia. The artist effectively captured their struggles, their journey and their experiences through an immaculately done dozen pieces in various mediums. This series brought out the subtlety and mundane experience of construction labourers, who flock to urban locations all around South Asia from the countryside to help construct buildings, roads and other infrastructure and then as quickly disappear once the construction is complete. Incidentally, this was the debut show of the Delhi-based artist.







### Portraits of Resistance – An Exhibition of Contemporary Sri Lankan Art

A group exhibition of contemporary art from Sri Lanka, titled "Portraits of Resistance" was presented by the Department of Sociology, South Asian University. The exhibition was organised in collaboration with India International Centre, Society and Culture in South Asia, India-Sri Lanka Foundation and Teertha International Artists Collective. Many renowned contemporary artists exhibited their collection, including Jagath Weerasinghe, Anoli Perera, Bandu Maamperi, Pala Potupitiya, Anura Krishanta, Pradeep Chandrasiri, Pradeep Talawatte, Jananda Laksiri, Danushka Marasinghe, Thisath Thoradeniya and Koralegedera Pushpakumara.

While providing a brief introduction to Sri Lankan contemporary art, Jagath Weerasinghe observed that the

year 1983 was indeed a turning point for Sri Lankan art because that year a group of artists came together and decided to stop dabbling in abstract art, as had been taught to them in art college. By the 1990s, these artists, mainly from small towns, had found a language of their own for their narratives and had started telling stories spun from their real life experiences and memories. There was much criticisms in the initial years but ultimately the beauty of their art overcame all.

### Africans in India: From Slaves to Generals and Rulers

A fascinating exhibit exploring "Africans in India: From Slaves to Generals and Rulers" was inaugurated on 21 March 2016 and was on display until 30 March 2016.

India and Africa have a shared history in music, religion, trade, arts and architecture. Although slavery and the African Diaspora are usually associated with the transatlantic slave trade and the Americas, many Africans travelled to India as traders and slaves, and then settled down to play an important role in India's vibrant history. Some of them, like Malik Ambar in Ahmadnagar (in western India), went on to become important rulers and military strategists. Ambar was known for taking on the powerful Mughal rulers of northern India. The Abyssinians, also known as *habshis* in India, mostly came to the subcontinent from the Horn of Africa. The exhibition explored this history through rare photographs, paintings and text.



### **Admissions**

The process of admission at the South Asian University began with the launching of a multimedia campaign and an announcement in major newspapers of all the SAARC countries, FM radio stations and select TV channels. Exhaustive information detailing the admission process, eligibility criteria, feedback mechanism, details of admission volunteers and other related information was uploaded on the University website. Candidates could register and apply online from anywhere in the world. Each application was thoroughly scrutinized to ensure that applicants met the minimum qualification to appear for the Entrance Test. The common entrance test was conducted simultaneously in 8 SAARC countries on 5 April 2015. One test centre each was set up in Afghanistan (Kabul), Bhutan (Thimphu), Maldives (Male), Nepal (Kathmandu) and Sri Lanka (Colombo) while two centres each were set up in Bangladesh (Dhaka & Chittagong) and Pakistan (Karachi & Lahore). Considering the large number of candidates and the wide geographical spread, 13 test centres were set up in different cities in India viz. Bangalore, Chandigarh, Chennai, Delhi, Guwahati, Hyderabad, Jaipur, Kolkata, Lucknow, Mumbai and Patna. Most SAARC Member States had appointed/nominated Nodal Officers to help and interact with SAU on all matters related to the conduct of the common Entrance

Test. The University received full cooperation from the Nodal Officers in each Member State. Since Pakistan did not appoint a Nodal Officer, the University had to make private arrangements at the Information Technology University in Lahore and the Federal Urdu University of Arts, Sciences and Technology in Karachi. A total number of 5858 candidates applied for the Entrance Test, and 5087 appeared for it. Offers of admission were sent to 605 candidates out of which 245 finally joined. The South Asian University strictly follows a recommended quota system to ensure representation of students from all the Members States of SAARC. Merit lists are prepared country-wise and the competition is only amongst candidates within each country. Seats left unfilled from any country are filled by students from other countries, as per SAU rules.

### Scholarships/Freeships

SAU is committed to awarding Scholarships/Freeships to needy and deserving students. The following Scholarships/Freeships were made available to students admitted to SAU in the Academic Session 2016-17:

a) President's Scholarships (For MA/MSc and LLM **students only):** Two scholarships are offered in each academic programme: one to the student scoring the highest marks in the Entrance Test in the Indian list and the other to the student scoring the highest marks in the non-Indian list (South Asian countries other than India) who finally joins the University. The scholarship comprises tuition fee waiver + hostel fee waiver (if applicable) + INR 7,000 per month as living allowance. Awardees also receive an amount of INR 10,000 (in respect of non-Indian Students) and INR 5,000 (in respect of Indian students) as a "Start-up Allowance" at the beginning of their tenure so as to help meet part of their inbound travel cost and book purchases etc, and as a "Pack-up Allowance" at the end to cover their outbound travel and excess baggage cost respectively.

The continuation of the President's Scholarship for the subsequent year is subject to good conduct and the recipients obtaining the highest CGPA in their respective categories.

b) SAARC India Silver Jubilee Scholarships for Master's and MPhil/PhD Programmes: SAARC-India Silver Jubilee Scholarships (SJS), instituted by the Government of India, are offered for Master's and Doctoral level studies to meritorious students coming from the Least Developed Countries (LDCs) of the region i.e., Afghanistan, Bangladesh, Bhutan, Maldives and Nepal. This Scholarship includes full tuition fee waiver + hostel fee waiver + living allowance of INR 7,000 per month (Master's level programmes) or INR 25,000 per month (MPhil/PhD programmes). Awardees also receive an amount of INR 10,000 as a "Start-up Allowance" at the beginning of their tenure so as to help meet part of their inbound travel cost and book purchases etc, as well as a "Packup Allowance" at the end to cover their outbound travel and extra baggage cost respectively.

SJS Scholarships are awarded to students from the LDCs scoring the highest marks in the Entrance Test. Students from India, Pakistan and Sri Lanka are not eligible for the Silver Jubilee Scholarships.

c) The continuation of the SJS for the subsequent year is





subject to good conduct and recipients maintaining their meritorious positions at the end of the second semester.

**SAU Merit Scholarships (For MA/MSc and LLM students only):** Ten scholarships are available in each academic programme: five to the next highest scoring students in the Indian list and five to the next highest scoring students in the non-Indian (South Asian countries other than India) list in the Entrance Test, after the award of the SJS and President's Scholarships, who finally join the University. The scholarship comprises tuition fee waiver + hostel fee waiver (if applicable) + INR 5,000 per month as living allowance.

The continuation of the SAU Merit Scholarship for the subsequent year is subject to good conduct and recipients maintaining their meritorious positions at the end of the second semester.

d) SAU Freeships (For MA/MSc and LLM students only): As per SAU mandate, no student will be denied admission to the University because s/he cannot pay the fees. Therefore, SAU provides free education to such students by waiving the tuition and hostel fee (if applicable). No additional support for living expenses is provided.

The continuation of freeships for the subsequent year is subject to good conduct and satisfactory academic performance.

e) SAU Tuition Fee Waiver for MPhil/PhD Students:

All MPhil/PhD students receive a tuition fee waiver.

f) Financial Support from SAU for MPhil/PhD Programmes: Financial support for MPhil/PhD students of INR 25,000 per month is awarded to students not receiving any kind of scholarship/sponsorship or JRF support from agencies like UGC/CSIR/DBT/ICMR etc. or similar agencies in other SAARC countries.

However, the continuation of SAU Financial Support in subsequent years is subject to good conduct and satisfactory academic performance.

**Duration of Scholarships/Freeships:** In all cases, scholarships and freeships are granted for one year. They are extended in subsequent year(s) subject to satisfactory academic performance, maintenance of hostel/university discipline and good conduct, to be reviewed at the end of every academic year. All recipients of scholarships and freeships must therefore be regular in attending classes and make full effort to sustain and improve their academic performance. The maximum duration of SAU MPhil/PhD scholarships is 5 years.

First year scholarships cover the summer vacation period at the end of the first two semesters. Scholarships for June and July to continuing students are disbursed at the end of July, after they re-join the University. In the second year of all Master's level programmes, scholarships and freeships cease at the end of the academic session, i.e. end of May and do not cover the summer vacation period at the end of the second year.

MPhil/PhD fellowships from external agencies: MPhil/PhD students who have qualified for JRF support from agencies like the Indian UGC/CSIR/DBT and ICMR, avail the fellowship as per the terms and conditions of the granting agencies. However, if they receive fees and hostel allowances, these are recovered from them to the extent of their allowance.

#### **Details of Scholarships/Freeships Disbursed:**

For the academic year 2016-17, President's Scholarships were awarded to twenty one Master's students, 3 from Afghanistan, 4 from Bangladesh, 3 from Nepal, 2 from Pakistan and 9 from India. Full scholarships under the Silver Jubilee Scholarships were awarded to 75 Master's students from the Least Developed Countries, while 63 SAU Merit Scholarships were awarded to Master's students which includes 8 from Afghanistan, 3 each from Bangladesh, Nepal, Pakistan, Sri Lanka and 43 from India. Master's students were granted SAU Financial Support with the quantum of financial support ranging from INR 32,500 to INR 125,000 per student per year.

Financial support was granted to 86 Master's students: 12 from Afghanistan; 14 from Bangladesh; 5 from Nepal; 10 from Pakistan; 2 from Sri Lanka and 43 from India. SAU Freeships with stipend were awarded to 11 and without stipend to 12 Indians respectively. Likewise, 134 Doctoral students were awarded scholarships of which 25 were Silver Jubilee Scholarships awarded to students from the

Least Developed Countries. The break-up is as follows: 5 from Afghanistan, 5 from Bangladesh, 1 from Bhutan, and 14 from Nepal. SAU Financial Support was awarded to 2 students from Afghanistan, 11 from Bangladesh, 11 from Nepal, 2 from Pakistan, 2 from Sri Lanka and 83 from India. 109 students received an amount of INR 3,57,200 per year under SAU Financial Support.

### **Student Activities**

#### **Student Societies 2016**

The year 2016, continued to be an exciting year for ECA societies. Students across disciplinary boundaries engaged enthusiastically with each of the five societies dedicated to Art, Music and Dance; Theatre; Film and Photography; Dialogical Explorations and the Book Club.

Students across departments actively engaged and participated in various events through the year like photowalks, film screenings, book discussions and panel discussions. Some of the highlights of the year have been a student-led photo exhibition which covered eclectic themes like refugees, markets/bazaars, conflict and everyday life in the city of Delhi. South Asia Speaks: A Forum for Dilogical Explorations, organized interesting talks on broad issues like Governance and Corruption in Afghanistan, Religious Extremism in South Asia and Education and Politics in South Asia. The Book Club also organized regular reading sessions across different kinds of literary genres.

#### **Cultural Activities**

#### **Spic Macay Event**

The new academic year started with a performance of Hindustani Classical music, by one of the most brilliant and serious exponents of Hindustani classical music Pandit Biswajit Roy Chowdhury. Pandit Chowdhury stands out not only for his singular commitment to music, but also for his conscious combination of all that is best in the Indian musical tradition. He showcases this integration of aesthetics through his playing of a varied repertoire including items such as *khayal*, *thumri* and *tappa* on his sarod. All these are informed by an acute sense of *raga*, *swara* and *bhava* and are elaborated within the intricate syntax of the *taal*.

He was joined on the tabla by Pandit Ashis Sengupta. Pandit Ashis Sengupta is a dynamic, versatile tabla player and belongs to the Banaras gharana.

The event definitely introduced students from across South Asia to Hindustani Classical music. And music surely is a connector in the region.





#### **Artologue: Art for All**

Art and colours excite both young and old. They help break the 'ice', when we have young students coming from different parts of South Asia. Keeping in mind the spirit of the region, Artologue, a group art acitivity, was organized on the orientation day to welcome the new entrants to the university. The Artologue project was about 'pricking the artist' in everyone. Participants were encouraged to draw, paint or simply splash colours. The idea unleashed a sense of creative community across cultural and geographical spaces. The event was led by Meenakshi J. and Jey Sushil. Meenakshi is an artist and has a post graduate degree in History and an MPhil in Art History. Sushil is a journalist by profession.

#### **International Mother Language Day**

The cultural committee of the University very enthusiastically organized the International Mother Language Day, and highlighted the linguistic and cultural richness of the region of South Asia.

#### **Sports Tournaments**

The Sports Committee organized various interdepartment sports tournaments. During the Hostel Festival, students participated in various sporting events including Football, Cricket, Marathon, Badminton, Table Tennis, Carrom and Chess. A few faculty members also joined in enthusiastically and were welcomed by the students.



### **Student Facilities & Services**

### **Hostel and Sports Facilities**

The South Asian University provides hostel accommodation to its students on a sharing basis. Students from outside India and Delhi NCR are given preference. The hostels are located inside Akbar Bhawan across four floors and currently house 117 female and 278 male residents. There are separate hostels for boys and girls. An entire floor is dedicated to accommodating MPhil/PhD students.

#### **Healthcare Facilities**

The SAU Health Centre caters to the students, staff, faculty members and all the employees of SAU and their families. The centre provides basic health care facilities for free. Though small in relative terms, it is well-equipped for emergencies and first-aid purposes. It functions from 08.30 am to 04.00 pm from Monday to Friday and on Saturdays from 10.00 am to 02.00 pm. The Health Centre remains closed on Sundays and other holidays as declared by the University.

The Medical Officer also looks after the administration of the Health Centre. Medical care is provided by the doctor and the supporting staff. Referrals to public hospitals and empanelled private hospitals are made by the University Medical Officer for services not available at the Health Centre like hospitalisation, investigations, specialists' consultations and treatment, as per University guidelines. The centre has one bed for patient observation. Medicines which are prescribed to the patient are purchased from the market and patients can claim reimbursement later. Taxi services are readily available to transport any emergency cases to the hospital.

The students are covered under the Star Health insurance policy for in-patient treatment, if required. The policy is renewed for them every year by the University.

The OPD attendance during the year under report was 2447 patients. Dengue cases were drastically reduced from 74 cases in 2015 to only 2 positive cases in 2016, out of which only one needed hospitalization. Only 2 Chikungunya cases and only 5 cases of Chickenpox were reported. The improvement in health and sanitation conditions in and around the campus contributed to this positive outcome. No mortality or morbidity was recorded.

The students and staff of SAU are issued circulars on all important matters of concern regarding infections rampant in the city and advised to take preventive measures. The Administration of SAU monitors all the ongoing activities of the health centre. Efforts are continually made to improve further the facilities at the centre and create awareness among the students, new and old so that their stay at the university remains hassle free.



### Prof. G. K. Chadha Library

#### PROF. G. K. CHADHA LIBRARY

The University Library was established to fulfil the academic and research needs of the students and the staff of the South Asian University. The current library is spread over a total area of 4500 square feet and functions seven days a week from 9:00 am to midnight. The reading rooms on the mezzanine floor and eighth floor are open round the clock.

### **Library Collections**

The library has text and reference books as well as journals covering all subject areas taught at SAU. Library resources include 12,713 books, 408 e-books, 7680 e-journals, 11 print journals, 14 databases, 28 CD/DVDs, newspapers, magazines, and encyclopaedia.

#### **Services**

The library provides a broad range of services including circulation (lending service), access to physical and virtual

bookshelf, Online Public Access Catalogue (OPAC) with Library 2.0, Current Awareness Service (CAS), full-text journals, online databases, Integrated Search Facility, inter-library loans through DELNET and references.

### **Off-campus access**


Prof. G. K. Chadha Library also provides off-campus access to subscribed electronic resources through the EZproxy. All valid library members can avail this service using their library user id and password.

### **Cyber Centre**

There is a cyber centre available inside the library with a capacity of 14 workstations. Library members can access electronic resources through these workstations.

The Library introduced the Summon Discovery System (http://southasianuniversity.summon.serialssolutions. com) provided by ProQuest:





### **Integrated Library System (Koha)**

The Library uses the Integrated Library System Koha (http://library.sau.ac.in) that extends its Library 2.0 technology facilities to all patrons who can search through our physical holdings, customise their user profile, subscribe to the RSS feed, get notified by auto email, hold or reserve an item, create their private/public book list, share an item list, comment, tag, rate an item, look into its search history, view most popular books, check borrower status, link with online social networks, etc. using this system.

#### **Events Organised by the Libraray**

#### **Springer Nature Author Workshop**

On 13 April 2016, the Prof G. K. Chadha Library, in cooperation with Springer Nature organised an author workshop titled "Springer Nature Author Workshop" for the patrons of the University Library. Dr. Kavita A. Sharma, President of the South Asian University, inaugurated the session.

The resource person was from Springer-Nature, and she advised our students on how to publish articles and books. Different publishing houses discussed their resources which are subscribed to by the library, and the Assistant Librarian informed all present about the library services, especially Open Access electronic resources and the use of Open Source reference tools.

#### **User Orientation:**

The Library organised a user orientation programme on 7.10.2016. The Assistant Librarian conducted a live session on how to use the University Library using the library web site http://library.sau.ac.in

#### **Book Exhibition**

The Library also organised several book eximplifications. Many publishing houses and book distributors displayed their new as well old collections on different subjects such as the Humanities, Social Sciences and Science & Technology.

#### A Re-conceptualised 'Introduction to South Asia'

Effective from the monsoon semester 2016, the 2 credit compulsory course 'Introduction to South Asia' has been completely re-conceptualised. The course is now offered in both, the Monsoon Semester and the Winter Semester to all incoming students of the MA/MSc programme. In Semester I, it is offered to students of Computer Science, Mathematics and Biotechnology while in Semester II it is offered to students of Economics, Sociology, International Relations and Legal Studies. This ensures that classes remain small and teaching is meaningful. Also, students are offered a range of options to choose from so that a multiplicity of interests can be accommodated. Though the primary focus remains South Asia, a variety of approaches are used to interpret it, from the sociological, cultural and literary to the economic and scientific. This year, 12 options were available to students out of which they had to choose two - one a general background course and the other a discipline-centred course with the proviso that they could not opt for a course offered by their own department or a faculty member of their own department. Some of the courses offered were centred around film; the legal systems of South Asia; the sociology of everyday life; international politics in South Asia and the history of mathematics in South Asia.

Since all the courses are now offered by faculty within the university, this ensures greater cohesion and accountability. It is also envisioned that the courses offered will be continually revised, updated and the number of options expanded.





# **Campus Construction**



### **Campus Construction**

### **Construction of SAU campus at Maidan Garhi.**

In the year 2016, significant progress has been made towards the construction of the new campus at Maidan Garhi. All required statutory approvals, including permission for cutting, trees were obtained from the Forest Department.

Construction of the new campus buildings has started on the ground in a phased manner as under:

**Package 1: (Boundary Wall and Site Office)** – The boundary wall on unencumbered land, and a site office have already been completed in January 2016 at a cost of more than INR 20 million.

**Package 2: (5 Nos. of Buildings)** - The tender for Faculty of Life Science and Earth Science, 3 blocks of Staff Housing, Faculty Club & Guest House and Guard House No.2 were opened in the month of January 2016. After obtaining all statutory approvals from various authorities, the work was awarded to M/s Ahluwalia Contracts (India) Ltd in May 2016 for an amount of INR 4010 million. The work on the ground started in the first week of June and is in full

swing as part slab of basement of LS & ES has been cast. Out of a total built up area of 4,74,976 sqm, 1,07,708 sqm is being taken up in Package-2. The work is scheduled for completion in December 2018.

Package 3: - (7 Nos. of Buildings); The tender for the (Administration building, Library, Institute of South Asian Studies, Faculty of Law and Humanities, Faculty of Physics, Chemistry, IT and Mathematics, Faculty of Art and Design and the Convention Center, and utility buildings, including external development of the site and landscaping was floated in September 2016. After evaluation of technical bids by a committee and detailed discussion in the BWC held on 16 December 2016, the work has been awarded to M/s. SPCL for an amount of INR 5888 million. The work, to start in January 2017 his a completion period of 36 Months. Total building area under Package 3 is 129,612 sqm.


**Package 4:** All other remaining buildings, those coming on encumbered land, are proposed to be taken up later after all issues have been resolved with concerned authorities in the coming year 2017.











# **Faculty of Economics**

The Faculty of Economics organized the second international conference on South Asian Economic Development on 18-19 February 2016. Eminent economist Dr C Rangarajan was the Chief Guest and Dr Atiur Rahman, Governor, Bangladesh Bank was the Guest of Honour. The valedictory lecture was delivered by Dr Bibek Debroy, Member, Niti Aayog. Prof Raghbendra Jha, Executive Director of the South Asia Center at the Australian National University delivered the plenary talk. The conference was well attended by participants from most SAARC countries.

The Faculty has an active weekly seminar series where we invite speakers from established research institutes or universities in the region. The details of all such talks organized are given later in this report.

It is also a matter of great pride that Prof Santosh Panda, Vice President and Dean of the Faculty was invited to deliver the first Madhusudan Das Memorial lecture in memory of Utkal Gaurab Madhusudan Das, considered to be the architect and founder of the independent State of Odisha in 1936.

Goswami Binoy and Namrata Gulati who were working on a project entitled "Bridging Relationship Gap: Has South Asian University served as a Platform?" have submitted their report to the South Asian University, which funded the project.

An Alumni meet was organized immediately after the international conference. Many of our students are well placed with jobs in the corporate sector or in Government while some have registered for doctoral work in India and abroad. The meet was a great success, facilitating a connection between the current students and those who had passed out.

# **Faculty of Legal Studies**

The Faculty of Legal Studies took several new academic initiatives this year. Of these, the course on International Dispute settlement has already become part of its academic structure while the one on the Legal Problems of the South Asian Diaspora will do so, in due course.

As in preceding years, a number of eminent speakers shared their research and practical work with our students and faculty in several key areas of law. The Faculty also organised interactive workshops and seminars on contemporary international legal issues as well as collaborations with other partner universities within South Asia and with international organizations.

In addition to this, attention has been given to the evolution of the corpus of research work within FLS to reflect the substantive and procedural legal issues with both international and domestic content. These

initiatives have given FLS a modest place in the South Asian legal community. We hope to continue to expand our footprint in the context of the larger South Asia in the years to come.



# Faculty of Life Sciences & Biotechnology

In an attempt to enhance its interaction with other SAARC countries and initiate a dialogue amongst the biotechnologists and biologists in South Asia, the Faculty of Life Sciences and Biotechnology hosted a South Asian Biotechnology Conference in Dhaka, in collaboration with Dhaka University, in which about 400 scholars and researchers from all over South Asia participated. The first conference in this series (SABC-2015) was organized between 12 and 14 February 2015 at the South Asian University and was attended by 150 participants from many South Asian countries. Since the feedback to this was overwhelming, the South Asian Biotechnology Conference has become an annual feature. It was also decided that SAU would collaborate with other universities in the region. Therefore, the second conference (SABC-2016) was held in Dhaka University on 5 and 6 February as a joint effort between Dhaka University and the South Asian University. The Third South Asian Biotechnology Conference (SABC-2017) will be held at Kathmandu, Nepal from 16 to 18 March 2017. The Nepal Biotechnology Association and the Central Department of Biotechnology, Tribhuvan University will collaborate with the South Asian University, New Delhi, to organise the conference.

The Faculty also organized an international symposium on HIV and Hepatitis in October and an international workshop in the area of Real-time PCR was held in December.

We also made significant progress in acquiring crucial research infrastructure by registering with CPCSEA which allowed the constitution of an Institutional Animal House Committee in SAU and which enabled the FLSB to open and functionalize an animal house in our premises where small experimental mice and rats can be housed. Authorization to use radioisotopes in research was also

received from the Atomic Energy Regulatory Board, Government of India.

Another significant endeavour was to update the teaching curricula for the MSc and PhD level courses. The contents of a variety of courses were revised to include the latest developments in knowledge in the various fields of biotechnology. Many members of the faculty brought in several externally funded research grants crucial for supporting the research work of our PhD students. A large research grant of INR 2.5 crores, sanctioned to Professor RK Saxena, funded the establishment of a confocal microscopy facility in FLSB which, we hope, will enhance the quality of the research work carried out by our students and faculty.

The Friday seminar programme saw some 20 well known professors/senior researchers from other universities and research institutions deliver research seminars and interact with the students and faculty. We welcome the two new faculty members who have joined the FLSB as Assistant Professors this year, Dr Dhruv Kam Sethi, a structural biologist from Harvard Medical School and Dr AKR Gobinath, a biochemical engineer from National Singapore University. With these new additions, FLSB

now has expertise in most major areas of research and teaching in the field of Life Sciences and Biotechnology.

In order to provide hands-on training in the latest techniques in biotechnology to researchers in South Asia, FLSB is organizing international workshops of 2 to 3 days duration on carefully chosen topics. These workshops have become highly sought after and participants come from India and other South Asian countries, comprising young faculty members, post-doctoral students, researchers and PhD students. This year Dr Ritu Gaur and Dr S Venugopal organized a one day International Symposium on HIV & Hepatitis on 1st September 2016. Dr R D Gupta and Dr A Mustafiz organized an international hands-on workshop on 'Gene Expression Analysis by Real-Time PCR' from 14 to 16 December. The total number of participants was 26 including two delegates from Bangladesh.

Dr Ritu Gaur also organized a Virology poster exhibition on 'Novel intervention strategies against emerging viruses" by M.Sc. Biotechnology Semester III students on 24 October, 2016. Dr Poonam Saxena organised a Microbiology poster exhibition on 'Microbial potentials and challenges' by M.Sc. Biotechnology Semester I students on 21 November 2016.



## **Department of Sociology**

The Department of Sociology has continued to produce both innovative and quality research in the year under review. The research papers presented by both faculty and students in various forums in South Asia and abroad mark the continuity in our self-conscious effort to engage with issues in and on South Asia in a nuanced manner. They also vindicate our commitment to knowledge production with a difference. In addition to teaching regular courses, organising extra-curricular activities along with invited lectures, we have persevered with our vision of broadening the disciplinary boundaries of our own discipline by delving into domains such as visual arts and other forms of culture while seeking to engender new forms of knowledge.

Scholars of eminence from various parts of South Asia visited the department and contributed to its academic processes. The 'Contribution to Contemporary Knowledge', an esteemed annual event of the Faculty of Social Sciences, this year featured Sugata Bose, the Gardiner Professor of Oceanic History and Affairs at Harvard University, who delivered a lecture on the theme, 'The Idea of Asia'.

Numerous other scholars as well as independent artists and practitioners also visited the Department, under the aegis of the three major platforms of the Sociology Department: the Sociology Seminar Series (coordinated by Dr Diya Mehra, Dr Chudamani Basnet and Dr Anuj Bhuwania); the Cinema and Society Series (coordinated

by Dr Bhuwania) and the Rickshaw student blog (Faculty coordinator, Dr Dev Pathak).

Apart from its regular series, the Department also organized 'Portraits of Resistance: An Exhibition of Contemporary Sri Lankan Art', in collaboration with the India International Centre, Theertha International Artists Collective (Colombo), India-Sri Lanka Foundation, and Society and Culture in South Asia, the departmental journal co-published with Sage. The exhibition was held between 22 August and 2 September 2016.

With Dr Ravi Kumar as Convenor, the Department collaborated with Rosa Luxemburg Stiftung, to organize an International Conference on 'Marxism and Contemporary South Asia' on 11-12 November at the India International Centre. Dr Ravi Kumar also organised, in collaboration with Rosa Luxemburg Stiftung, a series of 'Weekend Classes on Marxism' between 20 August and 6 September, in which a number of scholars were invited to lecture on relevant aspects of Marxism.

The third Young Scholars' Conference on the theme 'Youth Geographies in/of Contemporary South Asia', was held over three days, between 20 and 22 October. It was coordinated by Dr Diya Mehra and Dr Anuj Datta.

It is also a matter of great pride that Professor Sasanka Perera has been appointed Chair of the panel of judges for the 2016 'Gratiaen Prize for Sri Lankan Writing in English' by the Gratiaen Trust, Sri Lanka, established by the writer Michael Ondaatje.

### Independent Auditor's Report

### To the President South Asian University, New Delhi. Report on the Financial Statements

We have audited the attached financial statements of **The South Asian University** ('the University'), which comprise the Balance Sheet as at December 31, 2015, the Statement of Income and Expenditure account and The Statement of Receipts and Payments for the year ended on the date annexed thereto, and a summary of significant accounting policies and other explanatory information in respect of Consolidation its Operation Account and Capital Expenditure Account.

### Management's Responsibility for the Financial Statements

Management is responsible for the preparation of these financial statements that give a fair view, in all material respects, of the financial position and financial performance of the University in accordance with The South Asian University Act, 2008, Rules and Regulations made thereunder and the byelaws of the University (hereinafter called as 'governing laws/rules/regulations'). This responsibility also includes maintenance of adequate accounting records in accordance with the provisions of the Act for safeguarding of the assets of the Company and for preventing and detecting frauds and other irregularities; selection and application of appropriate accounting policies; making judgments and estimates that are reasonable and prudent; and design, implementation and maintenance of adequate internal financial controls, that were operating effectively for ensuring the accuracy and completeness of the accounting records, relevant to the preparation and presentation of the financial statements that give a true and fair view and are free from material misstatement, whether due to fraud or error.

#### **Auditor's Responsibility**

Our responsibility is to express an opinion on these financial statements based on our audit. We have taken into account the provisions of the Act, the accounting and auditing standards and matters which are required to be included in the audit report under the provisions of the Act and the Rules made there under.

We conducted our audit in accordance with the Standards on Auditing specified under section 143 (10) of the Companies Act, 2013. Those Standards require that we comply with ethical requirements and plan and perform the audit to obtain reasonable assurance about whether the financial statements are free from material misstatement.

An audit involves performing procedures to obtain audit evidence about the amounts and disclosures in the financial statements. The procedures selected depend on the auditor's judgment, including the assessment of the risks of material misstatement of the financial statements, and due to fraud or error. In making those risk assessments, the auditor considers internal control relevant to the University's preparation and fair presentation of the financial statements in order to design audit procedures that are appropriate in the circumstances. An audit also includes evaluating the appropriateness of accounting policies used and the reasonableness of the accounting estimates made by management, as well as evaluating the overall presentation of the financial statements.

We believe that the audit evidence we have obtained is sufficient and appropriate to provide a basis for our audit opinion on the financial statements.

#### **Opinion**

In our opinion and to the best of our information and according to the explanations given to us, the financial

statements give the information required by the Companies Act,2013 in the manner so required and give a true and fair view in conformity with the accounting principles generally accepted in India, of the state of affairs of the University as at December 31, 2015.

#### **Report on Other Legal and Regulatory Requirements**

Further, we report that:

- 1) We have sought and obtained all the information and explanations which to the best of our knowledge and belief were necessary for the purpose of our audit.
- 2) In our opinion, proper books of account as required by law have been kept by the University so far as it appears from our examination of those books.
- 3) The financial statements give the information required by the governing laws/rules/regulations in the manner so required and give a fair view in conformity with the accounting policies, of the University:
  - (α) in the case of the Balance Sheet, of the financial position as at December 31, 2015;
  - $(\beta)$  in the case of the Income & Expenditure Account, of the surplus for the year ended on that date.
  - $(\chi)$  In case of Receipt and Payment Accounts of Receipts and Payments for the year ended on that date.
