## Ethnographic Writing and Writing Ethnography

(Optional Course for PhD)

**Total Credits: 4** 

### **Objectives of the Course**

Key outcomes of sociological and anthropological research and theorization are texts, whether descriptive, analytical and reflective in their orientation. This seminar seeks to reflect on the practice of producing texts, particularly in the case of anthropological studies wherein writing ethnography has been both a key distinctive and subject of key debates, especially in recent decades.

To this end, the seminar seeks to 1) introduce students to seminal debates on ethnographic writing, narratives, voice and representation and 2) consider new genres of ethnographic writing, including the affective, multi-modal and multi-sited.

The seminar is also attuned to the requirement of graduate students to produce various kinds texts as they proceed through their dissertation programme. Thus, the seminar will also focus on academic writing conventions, forms and formats. In both cases, students will be asked to produce a series of texts through the seminar, and to contribute to a collective conversation about writing.

#### Unit 1: Classical Ethnography and the Writing Culture Debates

This first module of the course looks at classical ethnographic forms and their critiques including the *Writing Culture* debates. It also seeks to introduce question of ethnographic perspective and positioning, while introducing some examples of texts and critiques of texts considered canonical.

#### **Evaluation:**

Writing portfolio: through the course of the semester, students will put together a writing portfolio comprising 1) a brief topic analysis that outlines a potential research project 2) four pieces of ethnographic writing on a topic of their choosing. The focus of inquiry can in any genre – cultural studies, fieldwork based, multi-modal etc. Pieces can be separate but must be interconnected.
