FLS offers the **B.A. LL.B. (Hons.)**, **B.B.A. LL.B. (Hons.)**, **LL.M. (Two-Year)**, and **Ph.D.** programmes, with a strong emphasis on interdisciplinary legal education, rigorous scholarship, and research addressing contemporary regional and global legal challenges.

Applications are particularly invited from candidates specialising in the following broad areas of law:

- Criminal Law
- Cyber Law
- Intellectual Property Law
- Property Law

Researchers and academics working in other established or emerging areas of law and legal education are also encouraged to apply.

Role and Responsibilities

The Teaching Fellows will be expected to:

- Teach courses at the undergraduate and postgraduate levels in their areas of expertise and, where required, contribute to other courses offered by the Faculty.
- Pursue high-quality research and contribute to the Faculty's scholarly output through publications, collaborative research initiatives, and externally funded research projects.
- Contribute to curriculum development and academic innovation, while participating in academic administration, assessment, and student mentoring.
- Conceive, organise, and coordinate executive education programmes, Faculty Development Programmes (FDPs), international conferences, seminars, workshops, and other academic and outreach initiatives of the Faculty.
- Contribute to the Faculty's academic growth through interdisciplinary research collaborations, international partnerships, outreach initiatives, and institutional development.

The Teaching Fellowship is the University's flagship academic development initiative, designed to cultivate the next generation of legal academics by fostering excellence in teaching, research, and scholarly engagement. It offers exceptional early-career scholars a unique opportunity to develop their academic potential under the mentorship of distinguished senior faculty members while making meaningful contributions to the University's intellectual and research environment.

Teaching Fellows will become integral members of the Faculty's academic community, contributing to excellence in teaching, impactful research, academic leadership, and the University's growing international profile. The Fellowship provides an intellectually stimulating environment that encourages innovation in legal education, interdisciplinary engagement, and sustained scholarly excellence.

The Faculty seeks candidates who demonstrate academic excellence, intellectual curiosity, a commitment to innovative legal pedagogy, and the potential to contribute meaningfully to contemporary legal scholarship and institution building in South Asia and beyond.
